This week our class spotlight is on Year Three

This week, in Year 3, we have been taking part in a class TTRS tournament to improve our recall of the times tables. We have been working with fractions in maths and we have become experts at adding and subtracting fractions with the same denominator. In reading, we have been enjoying reading 'Dancing Bear' by Michael Morpurgo. In writing, we have been using direct address for our letters of complaint. Mrs Paskell was very impressed with how much we have improved our skipping skills in PE. In music, we have been learning the notes of the musical stave and we played 'The animals went in two by two' on the glockenspiels. Our PSHE work has led to some mature discussions about making healthy choices, thinking about arguments for and against. Well done Year 3, another busy week, full of great learning!

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This week our subject spotlight is Art

Just before Easter, we were treated to an artist in Residence who worked collaboratively with all of the children across the school to produce the amazing willow sculptures in our library. This week, it has been fantastic to see such a wide variety of Art across the school ranging from textiles in Year 1 to an amazing piece of collaborative sculpture in Year 6. Year 1 pupils have used mixed media to produce self-portraits, I wonder if you can guess who they are? In Year 2, the children have been experimenting with printing techniques while our Year 3 pupils have been exploring textiles and collage techniques, creating mandalas. In Year 4, the artist Giacometti was explored through figure drawing and elongated wire sculptures. The children in Year 5 have been inspired by nature in their textiles and sculpture work. Year 6 have enjoyed working together to mould and melt plastic and tissue paper to create sculpture based on the work of Chihuly.
