This week our class spotlight is Year One

In English we have been reading the poem 'Chocolate Cake' by Michael Rosen. We have been using clues and empathy to predict a character's actions. We really enjoyed watching and listening to this 'Performance Poem'. In maths we have started our new unit on mass and volume. We have enjoyed using the weighing scales to measure the mass of each object in cubes to find out which object is heavier. We collected lots of natural objects from the playground to practise using the scales and finding the mass of each object using non-standard units. In PE we have been looking at net and wall games. This week we were focusing on using a racket. In science we have revisited our learning on different animal groups. This week we looked again at the features of reptiles. In music we used untuned instruments to practise demonstrating dynamics. We made loud and quiet sounds whilst reciting a traditional nursery rhyme.

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This week our subject news is Music

The focus of our learning in music has been singing and the history of singing. In Year 3, the children have enjoyed learning to sing a sea shanty. We have learnt more about musical notation and are singing from a score. Across the school, the children have been singing as an ensemble in unison and some classes have begun to sing in two parts. The children focused hard on maintaining their own part to create harmony.

The children have been looking at ascending and descending scale patterns and having a go at creating their own phrases using their voices. We have had some wonderful renditions of well known songs and the children have been working hard to use accurate pitch. Early Years have enjoyed singing traditional nursery rhymes.
